BIBLICAL TRUTH

The gospel is made evident in the lives of Christ-followers through meeting the needs of the afflicted in the world.

CONTEXT SUMMARY

Since we have been commanded to make disciples of all nations, and poverty is rampant in the world to which God has called us, then we cannot ignore these realities. Anyone wanting to proclaim the glory of Christ to the ends of the earth must consider both how to declare the gospel verbally while also demonstrating the gospel visibly in a world where so many are hungry. If we are going to serve urgent spiritual need by sharing the gospel of Christ or building up the body of Christ around the world, then we cannot overlook dire physical need in the process. If our lives do not reflect radical compassion for the poor, there is reason to question just how effective we will be in declaring the glory of Christ to the ends of the earth. More pointedly, if our lives do not reflect radical compassion for the poor, reason exists to wonder if Christ is really in us at all.
